

Incident Overview

State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC) Activated to Level 3

- I. The SEOC is activated to level 3, actual event, for 2013 Spring Flooding Operations.
- II. On May 31st the Governor declared a disaster for the following Regional Education Attendance Areas (REAA): Alaska Gateway, Yukon Flats, Yukon-Koyukuk and Copper River.
- III. DSH&EM is making a request for an amended declaration adding the Lower Yukon Regional Educational Assistance Area (REAA) to include Emmonak and Alakanuk.
- IV. DHS&EM is developing a request for Federal Assistance in all affected areas needing Individual Assistance. Public Assistance will be submitted at a later date.
- V. Joint PDA will be completed Wednesday June 12, 2013.

Current Events

Galena

- Senator Olson visited Galena disaster area today
- Crews will continue to clean the Post Office
- HazMat Group will begin collecting hazardous material at the staging area as well as continue trash shuttle operation
- Continue trash shuttle operations
- Linemen will continue to replace power meters and realign power poles
- Develop a plan for the disposal of honey bucket materials

Areas of Concern

Galena

- Unable to efficiently dispose of refuse due to road damage between town and the landfill
- The water plant in Uptown was damaged by the flood and is out of service, some of the residence are now using honey buckets
- The Sewage Lagoon is at full capacity and has been contaminated with hazardous debris yet to be identified
- Hazardous conditions still exist in residential areas including chemical hazards, biological hazards, and unstable trees and structures
- Post office closed due to flood damage

Emmonak

- Emmonak is repairing their airport access road.
- Boil Water Notice still in effect.

Alakanuk

- Boil Water Notice still in effect.

The SEOC continues to monitor flood warnings, watches, and advisories, with due regard for at-risk communities; as well as the State’s current volcano and wildland fire hazard status. The SEOC continues to coordinate resource requests from local jurisdictions.

Talking Points 6.11.13

- The State is currently activating its Disaster Assistance Programs as a result of the Governor's Declaration of a Disaster for the 2013 Spring Floods
 - State, FEMA, and Red Cross damage assessment teams are finishing Preliminary Damage Assessments in the communities affected by the 2013 Spring Flood
 - The FEMA PDA is an information-gathering process and does not guarantee federal assistance.
 - **Individual Assistance Disaster Assistance Centers (DAC's) will open this week.**
 - The State Individual Disaster Assistance Hotline (1-855-445-7131) and Online Registration (<http://ready.alaska.gov/recovery/IA>) is open for those who would like to begin their applications outside of the DAC.

- Public Assistance will be available for State, Tribal and local governments, and certain types of Private Nonprofit organizations that are eligible under the Public Assistance program. More information at <http://ready.alaska.gov/recovery/PublicAssistance>.
- **Donations/Volunteering:** Many organizations (i.e., Tanana Chiefs Conference, American Red Cross of Alaska and other NGO's) are supporting the needs of the flood. Individuals wishing to support these efforts are reminded:
 - **Cash is Best** - Financial contributions to voluntary agencies can be used to purchase specific items needed on scene
 - **Collecting Goods Is Not Favored** – Clothing, household items, and food are best provided by well-funded voluntary agencies, receiving and managing these items is very expensive.
 - **Volunteering:** The best way to volunteer after disaster is through affiliating with a recognized disaster-related voluntary agency.
- **Galena:** Emergency response is ongoing; priorities are restoring essential services, HazMat clean up, and debris removal.
 - Power has been restored to most of the community, fuel stations services are operational, and the radio station is operational. Work is underway to provide electrical service to surviving residential and commercial properties.
 - DOT continues to repair the landfill access road, estimated 2 weeks to completion.
 - Waste is being moved by boat and helicopter as needed
 - DEC responders are currently on-site and working with DHS&EM, the City of Galena, and response contractors to begin a cleanup plan.
 - Sanitation continues to be a challenge, interim measures are being taken
 - Approx. 294 people were evacuated. Approx. 130 people remained in Galena. An estimated 180 homes damaged. 90 of the homes have major damage, 14 are destroyed.
 - **With the State's funding support, Tanana Chiefs Conference will be coordinating the return of the Galena evacuees and their evacuated pets, more information at this number: 907-452-8251 ext. 3091/3174**
 - The first phase of the return will be approx. 50 workers; they are scheduled to return tomorrow.
 - The shelter located at the GILA school is functional and equipped to support 400; 60 people are currently at the shelter. Some residents have reoccupied their homes.
 - The Red Cross began distribution of home care and personal hygiene kits.
- **Tok:** 1 home is destroyed and one home has major damage.
- **Circle:** 8 homes have major damage, 7 have minor damage.
- **Emmonak:** Flood waters are receding, DEC has issued a Boil Water Notice for the Area, roads are still usable but in poor condition.
 - Airport road was washed out, but repairs are in progress.
- **Alakanuk:** Debris removal and road access are the major issues for the community.
 - DEC has issued a Boil Water Notice for the Area
 - June 7 Flood Related casualty due to prior health condition exaggerated by flood response
- **Stevens Village:** 1 home and the road to the landfill were damaged.
- **All other flood issues** are being managed on the local/borough level.
