

Keep Stakeholders, Public, and the Media Informed and address any rumors or incorrect information in a timely manner.

Operational Period Command Emphasis (Safety Message, Priorities, Key Decisions/Directions)

In preparation for deployment everyone should inspect all of your field gear, replace or repair any unserviceable equipment prior to departing for your operation area. Check for proper fit of all clothing. If you are deploying to an area where construction activities are expected, then you'll be required to wear a helmet, eye protection, high visibility vest or jacket and ear protection (as needed). Draw these items from logistics if needed.

Each deployed division member should be conscientious of the safety of themselves and of other travelers. If you feel you are being put into an unsafe condition, bring it to the attention of other team members, the deployed team lead or the SEOC IC or Safety Officer.

Motorcycles are out in large numbers, they are difficult to see in low-light situations. Take extra care in looking for them especially when entering a main thoroughfare from your neighborhood or sub-division and when changing lanes or merging onto a highway. □

While operating or riding as a passenger on Off Road Vehicles(ORV's) always wear proper safety gear including boots, gloves, helmet and eye protection.

A Red Flag Warning also known as a Fire Weather Warning is forecast for much of Alaska over the next several days. This warning is issued due to dry conditions that could lead to rapid or dramatic increases in wildfire activity. Some communities may issue outdoor burning bans as a result of this warning.

All Field Staff and SEOC Staff must comply with the IC's requirement to minimize work hours (including travel back to lodging) to 12 hours. In addition, no employees in the SEOC are authorized to work in excess of five days. Field Staff is limited to seven working days. Any requests to deviate from this instruction must obtain approval from the Incident Commander

Receive weather brief prior to airborne operations. Nothing we're doing warrents pushing the weather or crew day.

Maintain communications at all times IAW established communications plan (when possible).

When flying, listen carefully to pilot's safety briefing and always wear ear and eye protection during all phases of flight operations. Know the location of fire extinguisher, and other survival gear. Wear your personal safety gear. If the plane makes an emergency landing you will likely only get out with what you are wearing. Bring a satellite phone on all flights. Do not fly if you don't believe the aircraft, pilot, or weather conditions are safe.

Bears will be foraging for food near villages, they should always be considered dangerous. Other animal could be forced out of their normal ranges by flood waters, they may be stressed by hunger and are very unpredictable. Avoid all wild animals.

It's calving season for the moose population, the cows will be naturally protective of their calves and can be very aggressive. Avoid all wild animals

Special Site-Specific Safety Considerations

Receive weather brief prior to airborne operations. Nothing we're doing warrents pushing the weather or crew day.

Maintain communications at all times IAW established communications plan (when possible).

When flying, listen carefully to pilot's safety briefing and always wear ear and eye protection during all phases of flight operations. Know the location of fire extinguisher, and other survival gear. Wear your personal safety gear. If the plane makes an emergency landing you will likely only get out with what you are wearing. Bring a satellite phone on all flights. Do not fly if you don't believe the aircraft, pilot, or weather conditions are safe.

Bears will be foraging for food near villages, they should always be considered dangerous. Other animal could be forced out of their normal ranges by flood waters, they may be stressed by hunger and are very unpredictable. Avoid all wild animals.

Don't drive or ride as a passenger on flooded roads. Use alternate routes when possible. Even if the water crossing the road appears shallow, what you can't see may be the greatest hazard. The road could be washed out and the water may be much deeper than you realize. Flowing water over roadways can hide an exceptional amount of energy sweeping even the largest vehicles off the road.

Any boating activities require a Personal Floatation Device (PFD). Make sure it's the proper size for the individual wearing it. In addition to your PFD, you should wear eye and ear protection anytime you are working in or around watercraft. Your safety and survival equipment should be readily available when traveling on any river system, if there is an emergency you may only have seconds to grab what you can and get off the boat.

A Red Flag Warning also known as a Fire Weather Warning is forecast for much of Alaska over the next several days. This warning is issued due to dry conditions that could lead to rapid or dramatic increases in wildfire activity. Some communities may issue outdoor burning bans as a result of this warning.

SEOC:


Respond to the medical emergency; transport to the appropriate medical facility and notify the SEOC as soon as practical. Cold wet and windy conditions will be present throughout the Operations Area(OA), dress in layers, for changing weather conditions.

Cold weather injuries:

Hypothermia is the condition of developing an abnormally low body core temperature. The current conditions in the OA are ideal for cold weather injuries. Mild hypothermia can be treated by warming the person. Get out of the cold and remove wet clothing and replace it with dry, warm clothing and blankets. Give the person something warm to drink, but do not give alcohol. Other techniques include using hot water bottles, warm baths, or heat packs placed under the arms and on the chest, neck, and groin. Do not warm the arms and legs directly.

Major Hazards and Risks

Rapidly changing weather is one of the greatest threats to aviation in Alaska, get a thorough weather briefing prior to all flight operation.

Wet and cold can be a lethal combination. Dress appropriately for changing weather conditions in your operating area

It's calving season for the moose population, the cows will be naturally protective of their calves and can be very aggressive. Avoid all wild animals

Bears are out of hibernation. Grasses and other vegetation use this time of year as their food sources are unseasonably late because of the prolonged break-up. They'll try to find food near populated areas and will be very aggressive especially the sows with cubs.

Narrative

Stay at home if you or anyone in your household feels sick. Wash hands regularly, using warm water and soap as a primary defense; use hand sanitizers in accordance with manufacturers' recommendations. Always cover your mouth when you cough. Cough into your elbow or shoulder, not your hand.

Temperatures are forecast to be at or below freezing at night; roads may become icy and cause hazardous driving conditions. Slow down and be prepared for changing driving conditions.

In preparation for deployment everyone should inspect all of your field gear, replace or repair any unserviceable equipment prior to departing for your operation area. Check for proper fit of all clothing. If you are deploying to an area where construction activities are expected, then you'll be required to wear a helmet, eye protection, high visibility vest or jacket and ear protection (as needed). Draw these items from logistics if needed.

Maintain communications at all times IAW established communications plan (when possible).

Each deployed division member should be conscientious of the safety of themselves and other travelers. If you feel you are being put into an unsafe condition notify the SEOC IC or Safety Officer.
